








Part 5 of Mystery Quilt - May 2014

1. You will be assembling a lot of pairs from combinations of 2 blocks:


The Fabric D (striped) block with corners attached and the Fabric C (plaid) with corners at opposite corners.



You will sew these two blocks together in two different orientations:


C Block

Orientation A:



Make 12 pairs in the Orientation A.

Orientation B:




Make 16 pairs in Orientation B.

Now take the 4 "Corner Blocks" that look like this (and have only one corner



And sew FOUR pairs with the Fabric D blocks used above in this Orientation C:




2. Put these 4 corner Blocks back into a baggie labeled CORNER BLOCKS



3. Combining 3 pairs each of Orientation A and B pairs from #1 above:

Pull out 3 each of Orientation A and Orientation B block pairs from #1 above. Sew first into pairs of 1 A + 1 B so that they look like this:



You will now have 3 of the above A + B combinations. Combine these 3 into a strip that looks like this:



Make three more of these so you will have a **total of 4 strips** looking like the above in orientation.


MOSAIC BLOCK #5 12" Finished

We hope you will enjoy doing this block as it is the easiest one in the group of blocks to assemble, but remember when doing it, it is important to press after each step and use scant ¼" seams. BRING FINISHED BLOCK TO JULY MEETING SINCE THE JUNE MEETING WILL BE OUR RELAY FOR LIFE AUCTION AND FABRIC SALE.

Light Fabric: Cut 8 4" Squares cut diagonally in half. Medium Fabric: Cut 1 7 ½"" Square cut diagonally twice. Dark Fabric: Cut 1 7 ½" Square cut diagonally twice.

<u>Step 1</u> Sew the Light triangles to either side of the Medium and Dark triangles. Square up to $3 \frac{1}{2}$ x $6 \frac{1}{2}$.

Step 2 Arrange the "flying geese" like the diagram below and assemble. Square to 12 ½".

When staring the first part of the pattern take your time cut and layout each piece as you go along, we found it was easy this way and you can see how your colors will look together.


